VINEYARDS / WINEMAKING:

This Pinot Noir is sourced from a selection of neighborhood vineyards that thrive near the historic Wohler Bridge that spans the Russian River. The fruit, 50% Estate Grown, was fermented with native yeast in open-top fermenters and aged for 11 months in 20% new French oak.

WINEMAKER'S TASTING NOTES:

Deep garnet color with aromas and flavors of black cherry, cinnamon, rhubarb pie and wet stone. Bright entry on the palate with a juicy succulent finish. This wine has all the pedigree of classic Russian River Valley Pinot Noir!
